On January 17, 1991, the placement of an incendiary device within the Federal Building, Rochester, New York, prevented the orderly conduct of Federal Court and other Government business within the Building, jeopardized the safety of personnel and property, and required the deployment of substantial resources of local fire, safety, and police personnel. These recent events compel heightened security on the Federal Building Property in order to both ensure the orderly conduct of the Federal Court, Government business and prevent injury to personnel and property.

Accordingly, and effective January 22, 1991, admission to the Federal Building complex shall be restricted to authorized persons having business within, who shall register upon entry to the Building and shall, upon request of Federal Protective Officer(s) or other authorized individual(s), display Government or other identifying credentials to such Officer or authorized individual.


The lawful assembly of persons is permitted on the sidewalk area in front of the main entrance of the Federal Building, where such assembly has traditionally taken place,

provided that such assembly shall not prevent access to the building to authorized users of the Federal Building.

Violations of this Order shall be subject to the penalty provision 41 C.F.R. § 101.20.315. Nothing in this Order shall be construed to abrogate any other federal law or regulation or any state or local law and regulation applicable to any area in which the Federal Building complex is situated (Sec. 205(c), 63 U.S. Statutes, 390; 40 U.S.C. 486 (c).
