THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE WESTERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK ANNOUNCES THE FINALISTS IN ITS 125TH ANNIVERSARY ESSAY CONTEST AND MOCK ARGUMENT COMPETITION

The United States District Court for the Western District of New York's 125th Anniversary Civic Outreach Program brought volunteer attorneys into public and charter high schools throughout the District during January and February of this year to teach a curriculum centered on the Supreme Court's decision in *West Virginia State Board of Education v. Barnette*, 319 U.S. 624 (1943). Students who participated in the Outreach Program were eligible to compete in the Court's 125th Anniversary Essay Contest, which asked students to apply *Barnette* and its analysis of the First Amendment protection against compelled speech to school policies. After reviewing many well-written and insightful submissions, on March 19, 2025, the Court selected the following winners of the Essay Contest:

Participants argued the positions they took in their essays and addressed questions from a three-judge panel comprised of Chief District Judge Elizabeth A. Wolford, District Judge Meredith A.
