The Problem

Every year, millions of children in the U.S. suffer from child abuse. Efforts to break the intergenerational cycles of child abuse can only succeed when science translates into effective interventions — but many child-serving systems remain isolated from each other. As a result of childhood trauma, many adults find themselves embroiled in substance use and abuse, interpersonal violence, and the legal and social service systems. Yet their providers remain unaware of how the current situation may be influenced by their past, but more importantly, what the state of the science is for helping their clients.
